Along with the rest of the world, during the past year CHPV has been adapting to the challenges of life after the pandemic. While Zoom Drop Ins had been quite successful, we recognized that our members were missing the socialization of in-person gatherings. So it was decided to have one Zoom gathering a month (now called "Zoom Drop In") and one in-person get together for lunch (now called "Lunch Gathering"). The Octoberfest was particularly popular with brats and beer/wine tasting. Zoom enables us to continue informational discussions with speakers and their on-screen presentations. 
